Pay by Bank: Delivering on the Promise of a Better Payment Experience

Improving the customer experience and reducing the cost of payments is now possible, as consumers and businesses share financial data in exchange for the value proposition of simpler, faster, and more secure checkout. Open banking has given rise to Pay by Bank (PBB), which promises to modernize ACH payments, making for a frictionless, secure payment experience for merchants and consumers. PBB has massive potential. In this session, speakers examine how PBB allows consumers to pay bills or make "person-toperson" transfers directly from bank accounts through a simple and secure process.
